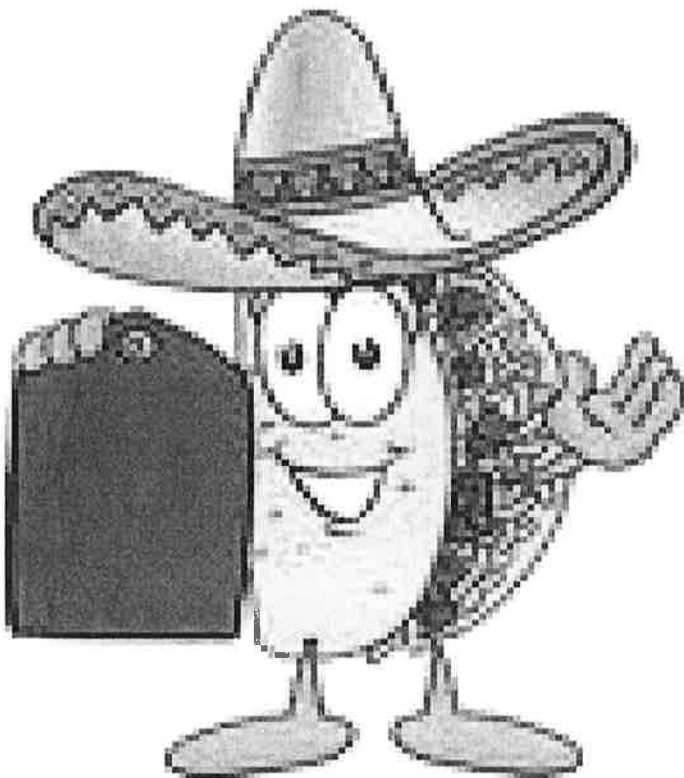

### **ROADS WORKER**

#### **Summary of Position:**

The Roads Worker is expected to manage the daily operations of the Roads Department.

#### **Position Reports to:**

The Roads Worker is under the direct supervision of the Public Works Manager.

#### **Hours of Work:**

8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. (flexible hours required)

#### **Conduct of the Roads Worker:**

- Is expected to conduct himself/herself in a manner that will bring credit to themselves, their employment position, and the Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit Council
- Is expected to carry out the policies established by Council and performed to the best of their abilities
- Is expected to be courteous, patient and understanding at all times, so as to earn the respect of both public and the Council
- Is expected to foster a spirit of cooperation and interest in the work at hand

#### **Duties and Responsibilities** (shall include but not be limited to)

- The Roads Worker will be required to schedule a brief weekly consultation meeting with the Public Works Manager, to discuss assignments, provide progress reports or any problems incurred.
- Responsible for the maintenance, inspection, and/or repair to roads, culverts, ditches, park, pow wow grounds, Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit buildings, snow removal, grass cutting, and, the use and care of the equipment used in these activities;
- Responsible for the operation and maintenance of various types of automotive equipment such as trucks, rollers, sweepers, tractors, lawn mowers, snow plows and graders
- Prepare time sheets, reports and other matters
- Able to utilize computer applications such as spreadsheets, word processing, e-mail, calendar and database software in the performance of work assignments
- Responsible for providing snow removal service for:
  - All roads – to remain passable for emergency vehicles
  - Band building parking lots
  - Seniors driveways 65 years and older (waiver to be signed)
  - Rental unit parking lots
- Responsible for grading gravel based roads regularly
- Ensure all roads are being properly maintained and free of weeds, so that surface drainage is not impeded



- Responsible for cutting and removing brush from the roadside, especially where it poses a hazard
- Responsible for maintenance of signs and other related items affecting public safety
- Ensure for the maintenance of Band owned properties, such as the Rental units, Mission Farm, Recreation Grounds, Pow Wow Grounds, Monument Park, Community Centre, Cemetery and Fairfield Cemetery
- To perform duties in a safe manner following generally accepted safety guidelines
- to perform any related duties as assigned, from time to time, by the Public Works Manager and/or as directed by the Director of Operations or the Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit Council as a whole.

**Potential Hazard Exposure:**

Job requirements may result in exposure to extreme temperatures, contact with fuel/chemicals on a daily basis and potential contact with human or infectious waste.

**Physical Requirements:**

Job requires the individual to be physically able, on a daily basis, to bend, walk, occasionally lift and carry up to 50 lbs. Operate vehicles: snowplow, grader, tractor, backhoe, trucks and other equipment and tools associated with the position.

**Dress Requirements:**

Comfortable, clean clothing along with steel toed shoes, ear plugs and safety glasses (with side covers) are required. A hard hat may be required for some jobs.

**Knowledge, Skills, Abilities and Attributes:**

- Good knowledge of the practices, tools, equipment and terminology used in the maintenance and repairs of roads, parks, and band buildings.
- Good knowledge of the use of automotive equipment used in the roads department.
- Ability to work with minimum supervision.

- Ability to manage; be resourceful; be tactful; and, be courteous.

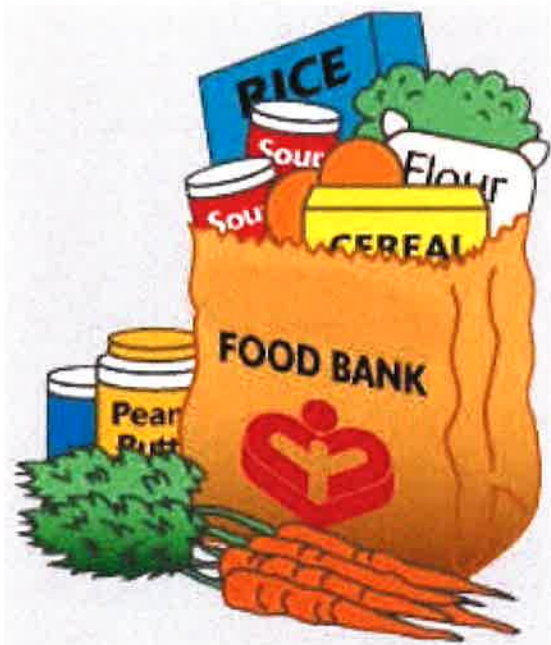

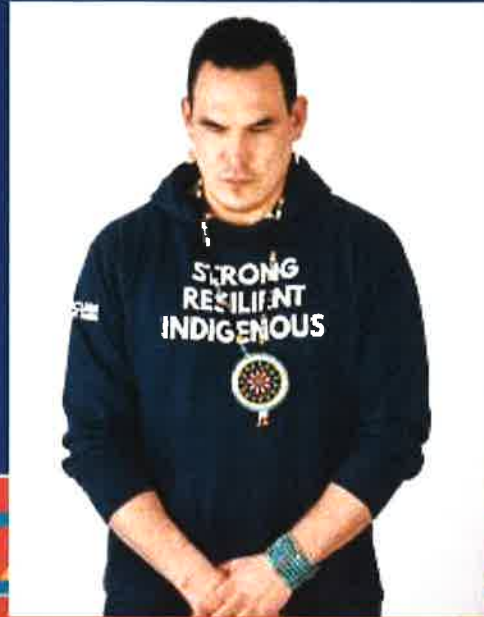

# 11 winter driving tips to keep you safe on Ontario roads



Here are some tips on driving safely on those roads

Ministry of Transportation recommends creating a 'survival kit'

Whether we like it or not, winter is on its way. Some parts of Ontario are already seeing some snowfall.

On Monday morning, Steven Del Duca, minister of transportation, joined MPP Indira Naidoo-Harris in Halton to ask Ontarians to do everything they can to keep roads safe this winter.

"We are asking all drivers to be our safety partners this winter," Del Duca said. "Help us keep our roads collision-free by preparing your vehicle, by planning your trip ahead and by slowing down in winter conditions."

Del Duca also said MTO has taken steps to improve its communication with motorists this winter with a more informative website and twitter feed.

Here are 11 tips on safe winter driving.

## 1. Create a 'survival kit'

Your survival kit should include items such as: gloves, booster cables, small shovel, windshield wiper fluid, first aid kit, torch, snow brush, candles, safety vest, water bottles and non-perishable energy foods.

Put the kit in the trunk of your car

## 2. Check weather and road conditions often

Choose the route you'll take ahead of time and check the weather forecast to make sure you know what to expect before you hit the road.

## 3. Keep a safe distance behind snow plows

If you find yourself behind a snow plow, maintain a safe distance. Snow plow drivers do not always have the best visibility and can create clouds of snow that can reduce your visibility, as well.

## 4. If you don't already have them, get winter tires

They provide better traction, handling and braking and can shorten your braking distance by as much as 25 per cent. All-season tires are not the same as winter tires. They lose their grip when the temperature dips below 7 C.

Drivers with winter tires are also eligible for an insurance discount starting Jan. 1, 2016.

#### 5. Slow down and give yourself extra travel time

This one might be obvious — but it's important. Drive according to the road conditions around you and don't rely on the estimated time of arrival your GPS gives you.

#### 6. Clear snow and ice from your vehicle

Make sure you clean all windows, mirrors, lights and the roof. Wait for any foggy windows to clear up so your visibility isn't poor.

#### 7. Wear comfortable clothes

It's a good idea to layer up in the winter time, but having too many layers can restrict your movement and make it difficult to check your blind spot.

#### 8. Keep a full gas tank

It can help reduce moisture in the fuel system and also adds extra weight to your vehicle to slow it down.

#### 9. Keep OPP numbers handy and travel with a fully-charged cellphone

The non-emergency number for the OPP is 1-888-310-1122. For provincial highway conditions, go to [www.ontario.ca/511](http://www.ontario.ca/511) or call 511.

#### 10. Avoid using cruise control on slippery roads

It's easy to lose control of your vehicle in bad weather if you rely on cruise control.

If driving conditions are really bad, or in the event of a serious ice storm or blizzard — just avoid driving altogether.

#### 11. Figure out the best way to recover from a skid for your vehicle

How your vehicle responds to a skid depends on whether or not it has rear wheel, front wheel or four wheel drive. If your vehicle has an anti-lock braking system (ABS), learn how to use it correctly.
