



Services for Youth

If you are an unemployed young person or a student, St. Clair College Employment Centre offers several Employment Ontario programs that can help you build skills or find a job – regardless of your background or circumstances.

Youth Job Connection is for unemployed young people (15 to 29 years old) facing challenges or complex barriers to finding work. These barriers include some combination of challenging life circumstances such as poverty or homelessness, limited work experience, a disability, low levels of education, or experiencing discrimination. The program offers opportunities for young people to learn about jobs and gain work experience so that they may secure long-term and meaningful employment. Through Youth Job Connection, you get:

- 60 hours of paid pre-employment training to prepare you for the workplace
- Job matching and paid job placements
- Mentorship, job-coaching and help with the transition to ongoing employment

For the year-round Youth Job Connection program, you must be between 15 and 29 years old, unemployed, not attending full-time school, and a resident of Ontario.

Youth Job Connection Summer also helps youth who face challenges or complex barriers to finding work, but is specifically for high school students (15 to 18 years old). You get:

- 20 hours of paid pre-employment training to prepare you for the workplace
- Summer jobs for up to eight weeks (or afterschool jobs if they don't conflict with school)
- Mentorship, job-coaching and help returning to school after the program ends

For Youth Job Connection Summer, you must be between 15 and 18 years old, a resident of Ontario, and planning to stay in high school or to move on to postsecondary education.

Youth Job Link is for young people (15 to 29 years old) who need help planning their careers and moving from school to work. Through Youth Job Link, you will:

- Improve your knowledge of career options and today's labour market
- Write your résumé, search and apply for jobs, and prepare for interviews

Get ready for the workplace by learning about teamwork, health and safety and labour rules

The program also offers a job-matching service to help connect eligible participants with employers. You must be 15 to 29 years old to qualify for Youth Job Link. You can be in school or not, and you don't have to be unemployed to get help.


