Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit (Delaware Nation) Referendum 2019

Topic: Cannabis Facilities Operating within the Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit (Delaware Nation) Territory



What is a referendum?

A general vote by the community on a political question which has been referred to them for a direct decision.

In this case the referendum will be on the Cannabis Facilities Operating within the Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit (Delaware Nation) territory. This vote will provide direction for Chief & Council regarding the retailing of Cannabis and the Operation of Cannabis Facilities.

Cannabis Legalization

Background: Cannabis in Canada is legal for both recreational and medicinal purposes. The federal Cannabis Act came into effect on 17 October 2018 and made Canada the second country in the world to formally legalize the cultivation, possession, acquisition and consumption of cannabis and its by-products.

Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit (Delaware Nation) Council passed the following motion on October 17, 2018:

Motion #05: Subject: Unlicensed Cannabis Dispensaries

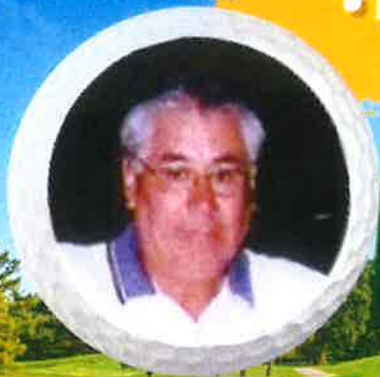
"That the Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit Council hereby directs that there will be no unlicensed cannabis dispensaries within the Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit territory (Moraviantown) until there are proper Tribal Law and regulations in place.

Failure to comply will result in legal action.

This law and regulations will be in place prior to the legalization of recreational cannabis."

A community referendum will be held during the 2019 Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit (Delaware Nation) Chief & Council Elections on the future of licensed (retail/medical) Cannabis Facilities Operating within the Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit (Delaware Nation) Council territory.

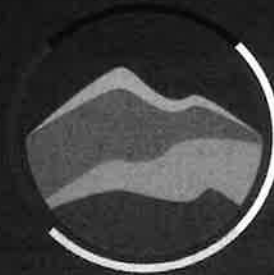

General Information

The Application and Selection Process

Applications are due May 31, 2019, and be found at indigenous.uwo.ca/indigenous_outreach.

There are 30 spots available in each program, and those selected will be notified by telephone and email by June 8, 2019.

After offers to the programs have been given out, successful applicants and their guardians are encouraged to attend an information session. Here they will be given program details, and be able to submit their \$75 program fee* and registration paperwork.

Program Safety

Mentors are hired and supervised through Western's Indigenous Services, and there will be a ratio of 1 mentor to every 5 youth. They help plan, help to deliver all programming, and are available 24 hours a day. The mentors accompany youth at all times, and stay in residence with them. They are certified in CPR and Standard First Aid, leadership training, and must pass a Vulnerable Sector Screening.

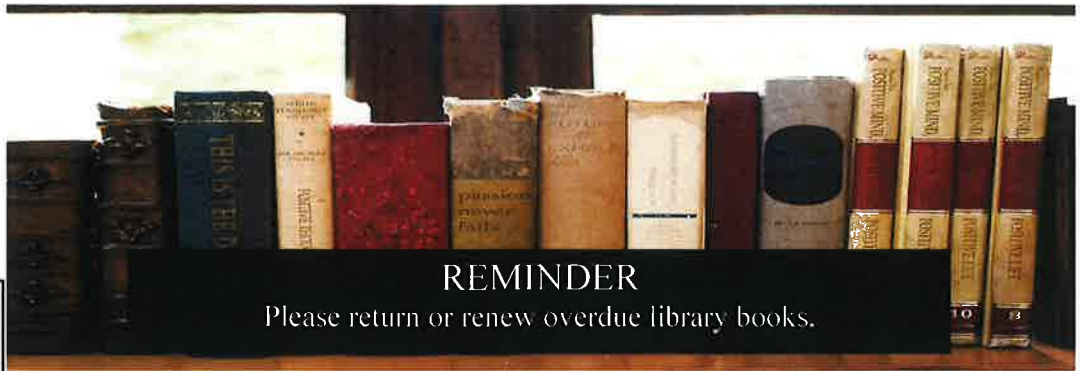

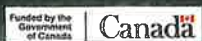
