Re: Modernization of the Ontario Gas Card Program

Ontario respects the entitlement of First Nation individuals and bands to purchase gasoline on-reserve exempt of Ontario's gasoline tax. The Ontario Gas Card Program is in place to effectively administer refunds of tax paid by authorized, on-reserve gasoline retailers to wholesalers when they purchase gas to sell in First Nation communities.

I would like to inform you of an upcoming change that will modernize the Ontario Gas Card Program. As of January 1, 2020, First Nation individuals, bands, Tribal Councils and band-empowered entities will no longer require the Certificate of Exemption (Ontario Gas Card) as proof of entitlement to purchase tax-exempt gasoline from authorized, on-reserve retailers.

In place of the Ontario Gas Card, First Nation individuals will now use their Certificate of Indian Status or Secure Certificate of Indian Status Cards (Status Card) as proof of entitlement for the tax exemption. A Temporary Confirmation of Registration Document, (an official document issued by the federal government) can also be used if an individual has applied for, and is waiting to receive a Status Card.

Bands, Tribal Councils and band-empowered entities will use a certificate which will be issued by the Ministry of Finance beginning in fall 2019.

During an engagement with First Nation communities, individuals and on-reserve gasoline retailers in fall 2016, and through a posting on Ontario's Regulatory Registry in January 2018, we heard that the Ontario Gas Card Program could be improved.

In response, the government is reducing red tape for First Nation individuals by eliminating the Ontario Gas Card, including the related application and renewal processes. Instead, only the Status Card will be required to verify First Nation individuals' entitlement to purchase gasoline tax-exempt.

This change will also reduce burden for on-reserve retailers by decreasing the processing time of gasoline tax refund payments and reducing the number of refund applications that are not able to be processed.

The Ministry of Finance will work with the service providers that offer an electronic refund request solution to some on-reserve retailers, as an immediate next step. This will help to ensure the smooth implementation of system changes to accommodate the Status Card. The Ministry will also be in contact with retailers, bands, Tribal Councils and band-empowered entities in fall 2019, in advance of and to prepare for the January 1, 2020 discontinuation of the Ontario Gas Card.

My Records, My Choice

The Indian Residential Schools Settlement Agreement lets claimants preserve their IAP or ADR records at the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation (NCTR).

INDIAN RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL CLAIMANTS MAY CHOOSE TO SHARE THEIR RECORDS OR KEEP THEM CONFIDENTIAL

If you made a claim in the Indian Residential Schools Independent Assessment Process (IAP) or Alternate Dispute Resolution Process (ADR), you have choices:

- Do nothing: your records will remain confidential and then will be destroyed on September 19, 2027
- Get a copy for yourself to keep or share with others
- Preserve your records at the NCTR for history, education and research
- Get a copy for yourself *and also* preserve your records at the NCTR for history, education and research

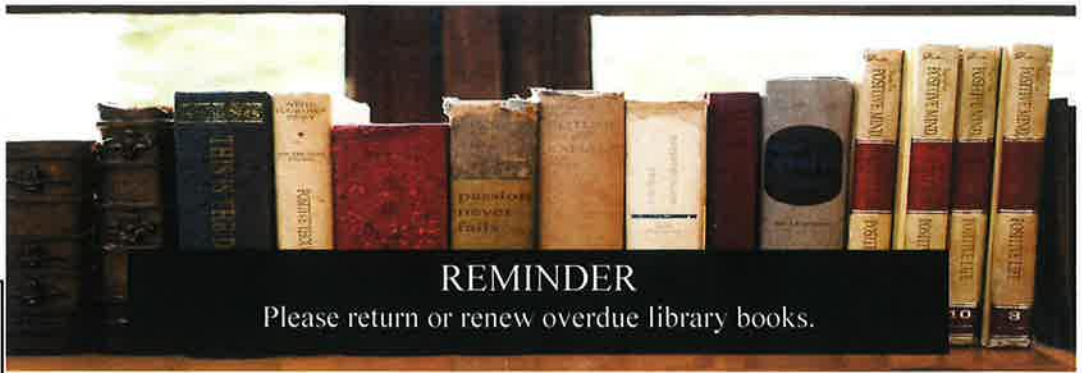

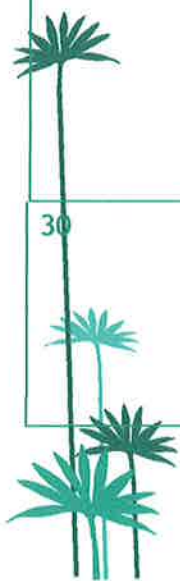

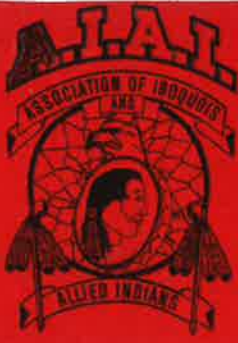

Upcoming Changes to NIHB Eyewear Coverage

On June 29, 2019, NIHB will make changes to coverage of corrective eyewear (glasses and contact lenses). These changes will make it easier to understand your coverage and will offer more choice — you will be able to use your coverage towards the purchase of any type of prescription eyewear.

These rates will be in effect for eyewear ordered on or after June 29, 2019:

Standard Coverage Amount	\$275* For prescriptions that are less than ± 7.0 (minimum prescription strength will continue to apply). This is the most common rate.
High Index Coverage Amount	\$415* For prescriptions that are ± 7.00 or higher.

* Clients in the Northern Territories and Atlantic region can contact their regional office for information on applicable rates.

How often you are covered for eyewear will not change. Children 0-17 years are eligible once a year; clients 18 years and older are eligible once every two years; clients whose prescription changes a lot may be eligible for early replacement of the lenses. However, frequency periods will be changed to a calendar year basis. For

example, for an adult who is eligible every two years, if you get new eyewear at any time in 2019, you will be eligible again on January 1, 2021.

There will be no change to the policy on exceptions. As was the case before, some clients will qualify for more coverage (reimbursement amount or frequency) based on their medical need.

Reduction of Dose Limit for Benzodiazepines – Ontario and Northern Regions

To help ensure the safety of clients, the NIHB Program is further lowering the dose limit for coverage of benzodiazepines. This change is being implemented region by region, and will take effect in Ontario and Northern regions (Yukon, Nunavut and Northwest Territories) on May 13, 2019.

Some clients may be exempt from these dose limits. Pharmacists should call the NIHB Drug Exception Centre when dose limits are reached.
