# **Unlicensed and Unregulated Cannabis Retailers (Dispensaries)**

The Eelŭnaapéewi Lahkéewiit Chief & Council are issuing this community bulletin regarding the unlicensed and unregulated Cannabis Retailers and Dispensaries in operation and those considering future operations.

On October 17, 2018 the Cannabis Act came into effect. The Cannabis Retailers and Dispensaries currently operating on reserves fall within the jurisdictional boundaries and regulations of those respective First Nations. At this time there is currently no legal framework for cannabis production and/or sales, these activities remain illegal and licensing requests will not be brought forward to Council until the framework is established.

On August 29, 2018 Eelŭnaapéewi Lahkéewiit Chief & Council passed a motion prohibiting activities related to the production and/or sales of cannabis.

The following motion was issued by the Council on August 29, 2018:

# MOTION NO. 05 SUBJECT: UNLICENSED CANNABIS DISPENSARIES

"That the Eelŭnaapéewi Lahkéewiit Council hereby directs that there will be no unlicensed cannabis dispensaries within the Eelŭnaapéewi Lahkéewiit territory (Moraviantown) until there are proper Tribal law and regulations in place.

Failure to comply will result in legal action.

This law and regulations will be in place prior to the legalization of recreational cannabis."

This means that effective August 29, 2018 all cannabis dispensaries are subject to enforcement of warrants, seizures and charges by the Local Enforcement Services working in coordination with the Eelŭnaapéewi Lahkéewiit Police Department.

There are serious public health and safety concerns along with unknown traffic trespassing onto our territory associated with cannabis use that must be addressed before we can even consider allowing the production and/or sales of cannabis to take place.

The results from the Community Referendum held June 1, 2019 positively supported both Licensed Recreational and/or Medicinal Cannabis facilities within the Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit territory. A specific Task Force that will oversee the research on and not limited to the following:

- · Business Policies, Permits. Regulations, Licensing
- Health / Safety / Quality Standards

# **Eelunaapeewi Lahkeewiit Library**

## **Update:**

The Library is in a heritage building over one hundred and fifty years old; while this is a very historical structure it houses part of our recent legacy; it also shows its age.

The immediate concerns over health and safety are what prompted the application to the Gambling Revenue monies. The front steps

(those facing the river) plus the rear stairs and handicapped ramp deteriorated, the supports underneath had rotted away as well. The exterior stairs and ramp have been rebuilt and for easier access. They are now up to code. Painting and staining will be done in the spring. Exterior lighting is going to be upgraded as well. An electrician has recommended dusk to dawn security lighting to meet those needs

Interior work is being completed as well. Many of the shelving in the Library was not meant to be high capacity. Those shelves are warped, and some have collapsed once books were removed. Over \$17,000 worth of library grade shelving has been ordered. Once those shelves arrive in 2020, the Library will be able to be divided into specific rooms such as AV, Reference, Children's and Archives.

The Library has started to catalogue our collection into a computer system. These will be marked with barcodes and catalogued with Dewey Decimal system labels. Patrons will also have library cards with barcodes. This should allow borrowers to check in and out quickly and keep track of all items that they had checked out. This will be ongoing.

### **Programs**

No monies have been set aside to run programs but different plans with, the Kindergarden and Headstart have partnered with the Library offering cataloguing materials as well as sharing crafting time/supplies to the public. This craftiness is held Tuesday evenings at Headstart until the new year.

While there is no WIFI available, there are computers available for Internet searches. A large black and white photocopier is also available. Since it is free, the Library has a Facebook page online and we are keeping current events listed there.

On the first Wednesday of the month there is a scheduled movie night unless otherwise listed.
