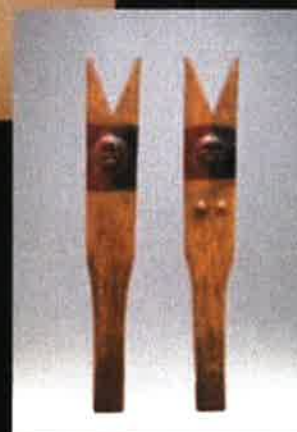

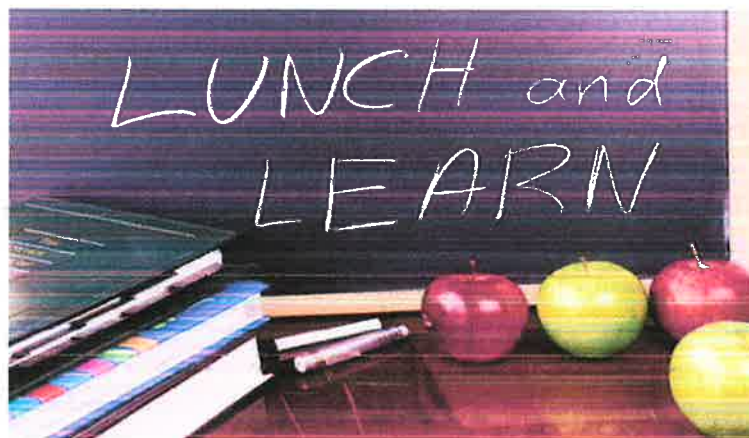

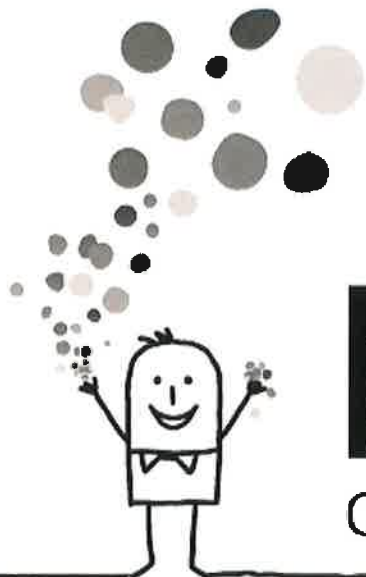
## P.A. Day
