Summary of Position:

To maintain a clean and healthy environment for the Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit (Delaware Nation) Administration Office, Employment & Training Centre, and Library/Land claims.

Position Reports to:

The Public Buildings Custodial Maintenance Worker is under the direct supervision of the Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit Director of Operations in conjunction with Executive Assistant.

Duties and Responsibilities (shall include but not be limited to)

- Sweep, dust, mop all floors in office and common areas, meeting rooms, entrances
- Vacuum all rugs in offices, common areas, meeting rooms, entrance areas, etc.
- Clean & disinfect all bathroom fixtures, countertops, sink fixtures, wastebaskets, door hardware & telephones
- Replenish all bathroom tissue, paper towels, soap and air fresheners, as needed
- Dust all desks, computers, blinds, and all office equipment
- Remove all soil marks on walls and doors
- Bag garbage daily and move to outside bins
- Replace all burnt out light bulbs and fluorescent tubes in the interior and exterior of the buildings
- Keep accurate inventory of all cleaning products and equipment and inform supervisor, in writing, of supplies/repairs, complete with costs attached
- Keep cleaning-storage areas organized and clean
- Remove all dirt, ice and snow from entrances, steps and sidewalks of buildings
- Keep exterior of buildings free of garbage
- Empty exterior garbage bins and cigarette bins on a weekly basis
- Ensure bins are ready for pick-up weekly
- Ensure recycling is prepared for pick-up bi-weekly
- Clean council chambers after every meeting
- Develop and maintain cleaning schedule for interior rugs
- Clean fridges, stove, oven and range hood
- Wash all windows (interior & exterior), desk mats, interior trim, notice/chalk board and light fixtures on a quarterly basis

Housing Programs:

1. **New Housing Construction Loan Program**
 - A loan provided by Delaware Nation Council. After screening, applicants with the highest score are notified. Builders are selected. Monthly payments are to be made; once the loan is paid in full land is given back to the homeowner.
2. **Housing Improvement Loan Program**
 - Provided by Delaware Nation Council. Renovation loans, Applications are screened, if eligible you are given an inspection to record the type of work requested. Two estimates are to be provided by the homeowner and returned to housing. Housing director will set up a meeting to sign contracts/land transfer. Loan payments are to be made monthly until paid in full.
3. **RRAP- Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program**
 - CMHC is the funder for this renovation program; housing department **only** handles sending in applications, inspections and payments to contractor. Applications are not accepted if you have received RRAP in the past 15 years or you owe money to any Delaware Nation department.
4. **Rental Program**
 - Applicants may apply at anytime, must be the age majority and provided they don't owe money to the band. Applications must be updated every **three** months or your name will be removed from the waiting list. Rental units are given to successful applicants based on the ability to pay rental fees, size of the unit and size of occupants. The Housing Director will not promote over crowding in any rental unit.
5. **Bank Of Montreal- Housing Loan program**
 - This program allows for new construction, renovations or purchase of a home on reserve. Delaware Nation is responsible for the verification of the membership, and to provide council's guarantee to back the loan and inspections.
6. **Contractor Program**
 - Ensure all contractor's/builder's are fully licensed and using licensed plumber's and electrician's on all new construction and housing improvements. Contractor will be responsible for all building material costs.

Most of these programs are offered when funding is available. When loans are available they will be listed in the Delaware Nation Bi-weekly newsletter.

Maintenance Schedule

Fall

- Have furnace or heating system serviced by a qualified service company every two years for gas furnace and every year for oil furnace.
- Open furnace humidifier damper on units with central air conditioning and clean humidifier.
- Lubricate circulating pump in hot water heating system.
- Bleed air from hot water radiators.
- Examine the forced air furnace fan belt for wear, looseness or noise; clean fan blades of any dirt build up (after disconnecting the electricity on the motor first)
- Turn ON gas furnace pilot light
- Check and clean or replace furnace air filters each month during heating season. Ventilation system, such as heat recovery ventilator, filters should be checked every two months.
- Vacuum electric baseboard heaters to remove dust.
- Remove the grilles on forced air systems and vacuum inside the ducts.
- If the heat recovery ventilator has been shut off for the summer, clean the filters and the core, and pour water down the condensate drain to test it
- Clean portable humidifier, if one is used
- Have well water tested for quality. It is recommended that you test for bacteria every 6 months.
- Check sump pump and line to ensure proper operation, and to ascertain that there are no line obstructions or visible leaks
- Replace window screens with storm windows
- Remove screens from the inside of casement windows to allow air from the heating system to keep condensation off window glass
- Ensure all doors to the outside shut tightly, and check other doors for ease of use. Renew door weather stripping if needed.
- If there is a door between your house and garage, check adjustment of the self closing device to ensure it closes the door completely
- Ensure windows and skylights close tightly
- Cover the outside of air conditioning units.
- Ensure that the ground around your home slopes away from the foundation wall, so that water does not drain into your basement
- Clean leaves from eavestroughs and roofs and test downspouts to ensure proper drainage from the roof
- Check chimneys for obstructions such as nests
- Drain and store outdoor hoses. Close valve to outdoor hose connection and drain the house bib (Exterior faucet), unless your house has frost proof hose bibs.
- Septic Tank – measure the sludge and scum to determine if the tank needs to be emptied before the spring. Tanks should be pumped out at least once every three years.
- Winterize landscaping, for example, store outdoor furniture, prepare gardens and if necessary protect young trees or bushes for winter.

Winter

- Check and clean or replace furnace air filters each month during the heating season. Ventilation system, such as heat recovery ventilator, filters should be checked every two months.
- After consulting your hot water tank's owner's manual, drain off a dishpan full of water from the clean out valve at the bottom of you hot water tank to control sediment and maintain efficiency.
- Clean humidifier two or three times during the winter season
- Vacuum bathroom fan grille
- Vacuum fire and smoke detectors, as dust or spider webs can prevent them from functioning
- Check gauge on all fire extinguishers; recharge or replace if necessary.
- Check fire escape routes, door and window locks and hardware and lighting around outside of house; ensure family has good security habits
- Check the basement floor drain to ensure the trap contains water. Refill with water if necessary.
- Monitor your home for excessive moisture levels – for example condensation on windows, which can cause damage over time and pose health problems and take corrective action.
- Check all faucets for signs of dripping and change washers as needed. Faucets requiring frequent replacement of washers may be in need of repair.
- If you have a plumbing fixture that is not used frequently, such as a laundry tub, or spare bathroom sink, tub, shower stall, run some water briefly to keep water in the trap
- Clean drains in dishwashers, sinks, bathtubs and shower stalls
- Test plumbing shut-off valves to ensure they are working and to prevent them from seizing.
- Examine windows and doors for ice accumulation or cold air leaks. If found, make a note to repair or replace in the spring
- Examine attic for frost accumulation. Check roof for ice dams or icicles. If there is excessive frost or staining of the underside of the roof, or ice dams consult for advice.
- Check electrical cords, plugs and outlets for all indoor and outdoor seasonal lights to ensure fire safety; if worn, or plugs or cords feel warm to touch, replace immediately.

Jury Duty Fact Sheet – Indigenous Recipients

Juries play an important role in criminal and civil trials, as well as coroner's inquests. The wisdom and experience of First Nation individuals is valuable to others at trials and inquests. Your assistance in completing the questionnaire is an important step in the Jury Roll process.

Jury Questionnaires

To identify potential jurors, jury questionnaires are sent to randomly selected individuals throughout the province every year. Because names are chosen randomly, some people may never receive a jury questionnaire and others may receive them more frequently.

You will receive a jury questionnaire only if your name is randomly selected from a list of persons registered under the Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP).

If your name is selected, you will be mailed a jury questionnaire, together with an instruction sheet, Minister's letter and prepaid reply envelope.

If you receive a questionnaire please answer the questions and mail it back within 30 calendar days. **Not all individuals who complete a questionnaire will be called for jury duty.**

Jury Selection Process

Once the questionnaires are completed and mailed, they are reviewed for eligibility. The names of people who are eligible are added to a list which is called the **jury roll**. If a jury is needed, names are randomly selected from the jury roll and the individuals randomly selected are summoned for jury duty. A **jury panel** is the list of all people who are summoned to court at the same date and time.

Not all individuals on a jury roll will be randomly selected to be on a jury panel.

If you have been chosen for a jury panel, you will receive a summons that indicates the date and court location where you need to attend for potential jury duty.

If you are unable to attend, if attendance would cause hardship for you or others, or if attendance would not be compatible with your spiritual beliefs, please contact the local court at the phone number provided on the summons to talk to court staff about whether you can be deferred to a later date or to get information on how to request an excusal from jury duty.

Once at court, jury panel members are called in random order to be considered to serve on a jury. If your name is chosen, and you are not deferred, excused or challenged by one of the parties to the upcoming trial, you will serve as a juror for that trial. **Not all individuals who attend court for jury duty will be selected to be jurors.**

Serving as a Juror

Daily Fees: If you are selected to sit on a jury you will receive the following payment:

- From day 1 to 10: No payment
- From day 11 to 49: \$40.00 per day
- From day 50 to the last day of trial: \$100.00 per day. Trials of this length are rare.

Employers are required by law to allow employees time off for jury duty. The law does not require employers to pay salary for employees summoned for jury duty, although some employers do. If you are summoned for jury duty, you should ask your employer whether you will be paid during this time.

Time Commitment: Regardless of whether it is a criminal or a civil trial or Coroner's Inquest, some jurors may be required to sit on a jury for several days or for several weeks. There is no set time limit. The judge will advise jurors as to the estimated length of the trial.

Dress: There are no specific dress requirements for jurors.

Disability and Accommodation: Every effort will be made to provide necessary accommodations for people with disabilities to participate in the jury process, subject to the approval of a judge. For example: technical, personal, interpretive or other support services may enable persons with disabilities to serve on a jury.

Frequently Asked Questions About Being a Juror

How are people selected to receive a questionnaire?

A list of names and addresses of potential jurors is provided by the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care from a database of persons registered under the Ontario Health Insurance Plan (or "OHIP") in the spring of each year. The Ministry of the Attorney General sends a Jury Questionnaire to individuals whose names are randomly selected from this list.

I am a Leader of an Indigenous Community (e.g., Elder, Senator, Traditional Knowledge Keeper, Traditional Helper, Council Member, First Nation Chief, Clan Mother or a Customary Leader). Am I eligible for jury duty?

In accordance with the *Juries Act*, Indigenous Community Leaders may be eligible for jury duty.

Please complete and return your questionnaire. If your answers to the rest of the questionnaire reveal that you are eligible for jury duty, your name will be added to the jury roll.

If you receive a summons and feel that, due to your duties in the community, your serving as a juror would cause serious hardship to others, you can ask to be excused from jury service on that basis. To do so, please contact the local court office using the information provided on the summons so that your request can be considered by a judge of the Superior Court of Justice.

What if serving as a juror is incompatible with my spiritual beliefs?

If you receive a summons for jury duty, you may ask to be excused from service if serving on a jury would cause serious hardship to yourself or your community, or if service as a juror is incompatible with your spiritual beliefs or practices.

If you have received a questionnaire, please complete it and mail it back using the postage-paid envelope provided. If you receive a summons to attend court for jury selection, you may request an excusal or deferral by writing to your local court office and explaining how your beliefs or practices conflict with jury duty. Your request will be considered by a judge of the Superior Court of Justice.

What if I don't identify as being a Canadian Citizen?

If you are First Nations, Métis or Inuit and do not identify as a Canadian citizen, you may indicate your Indigenous citizenship or nationality in-writing next to the question about Canadian citizenship and proceed to complete the rest of the questionnaire.

For the purposes of the jury roll, a person is considered to be a Canadian citizen if:

- they were born in Canada and, at the time of their birth, their parents were either citizens or permanent residents of Canada;
- have received their certificate of citizenship; or
- they were born outside Canada and one of their parents was a Canadian citizen at the time of their birth.

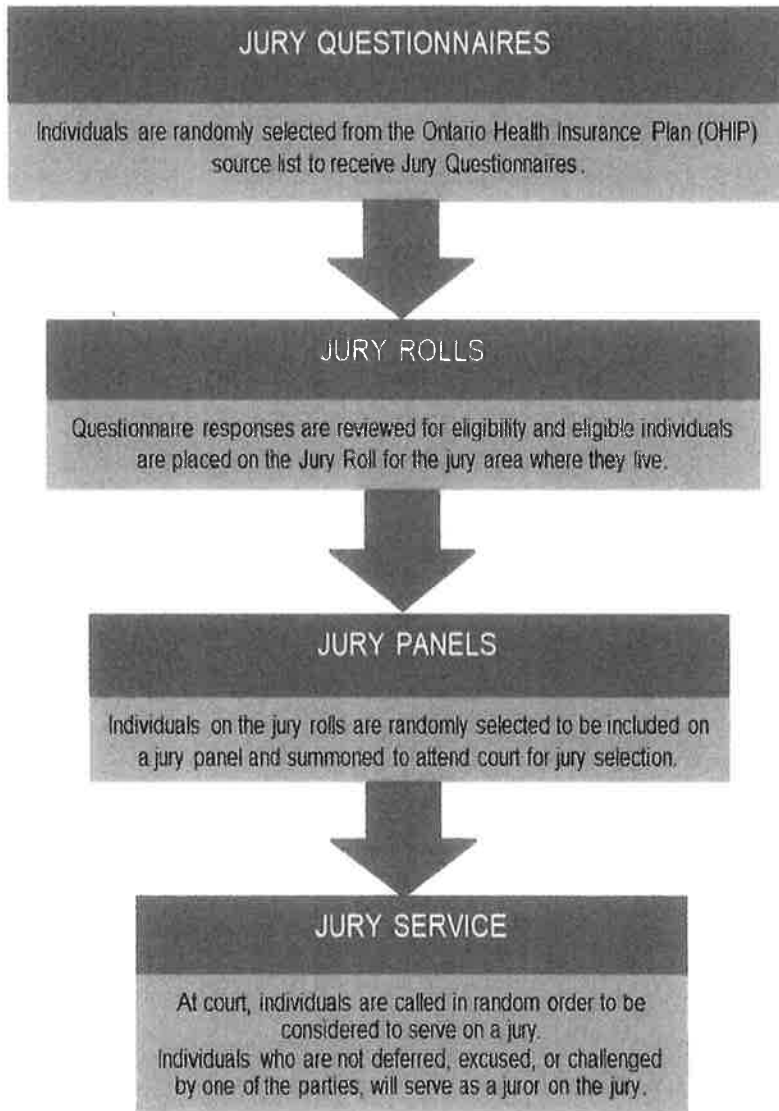
How are my expenses paid while I am participating in the jury process?

Expenses like meals, hotels and return travel may be covered depending on the circumstances (e.g., if a juror is required to remain overnight at the city or town where the trial is held).

Please contact the local courthouse to confirm which expenses will be paid and to request assistance with making travel and hotel arrangements and payment. Contact information is provided on the summons.

What is the process through which jurors are chosen?
