Non-Members Require Residency Permit

It has come to the Eelŭnaapéewi Lahkéewiit (Delaware Nation) Council's attention that there are Non-Members who may or may not know that pursuant to the inherent right of the Eelŭnaapéewi Lahkéewiit, the Council may permit, deny or revoke any granted residency. This has been in effect since 2010 and has been reinforced with the following Council motion, dated July 5th, 2017:

MOTION #3 Subject: RESIDENCY

"That Chief and Council hereby serve notice to community that all non-members residing without a Residency Permit must apply on or before July 14, 2017; failure to comply will result in removal from community."


This Community Bulletin is being issued to advise that this motion is in effect and that anyone who are not registered Eelŭnaapéewi Lahkéewiit (Delaware Nation) members and are residing within Moraviantown still require a Residency Permit.

Please note: there are non-refundable monetary fees for a probationary application, completion of a successful probationary period and thereafter, an annual renewal of approved residency permit.

The Post Secondary and Administrative Support Assistant will be a part of the Eelünaapéewi Lahkéewiit Education Department team in its' support of the lifelong learning goals of the Delaware Nation membership.

EMPLOYMENT CONDITIONS

This will be a contract position from March 9, 2020 until September 4, 2020. Renewal will be dependent upon employee performance and funding.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES (to include but not be limited to the following):

- Analyze and gain a strong working knowledge of the Eelünaapéewi Lahkéewiit Post Secondary Policy.
- Keep abreast of the latest procedures, guidelines and funding for government agencies, post secondary institutions and other regulatory bodies.
- Recommend policy amendments as required to reflect changes with post secondary institution protocols, government policies and student needs.
- Through positive communication, support, advocate and provide direction to applicants and post secondary students to assist them in succeeding with their academic goals.
 - Ensure post secondary applications are complete and accurate.
- Provide sponsorship letters to successful applicants and corresponding post secondary institutions in a timely manner and in accordance with the Delaware Nation Post Secondary Policy.
- Create and maintain a detailed tracking system of post secondary students throughout their academic careers to ensure requirements of students and Post Secondary and Administrative Support Assistant are promptly met.
- Oversee post secondary budget, including forecasting, monitoring and reporting.
 - Answer phones for Education Department and forward to appropriate staff.
- Assist Education Manager and Education Staff to meet Delaware Nation Finance Department deadlines and requirements.
- Provide support to Education Manager and Staff in meeting educational goals and needs of community.
- Take lead in developing and completing community events as required including but not limited to the Annual Education Awards Banquet, Professional Activity Days and Lambton Kent District School Board liaison meetings.




DESCRIPTION

The Indigenous Internship Program at the Canadian Museum of History and the Canadian War Museum offers professional and technical training to First Nations, Métis and Inuit participants. The Program operates every year from September to April, with a two-week break for the holiday season.

OBJECTIVE

The Program's objective is to offer practical experience for Indigenous People who would like to broaden their knowledge and skills related to various aspects of museum work.





CONTENT

During the training year, candidates can undertake practicum assignments lasting four to five weeks in the areas of Research, Collections, Conservation, Exhibitions, Public Programs, Corporate Affairs, Development and Museum Services.

ELIGIBILITY

Candidates must have a secondary school diploma or experience in cultural heritage preservation or interpretation within a museum-related work environment.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

The Canadian Museum of History provides a modest stipend, pays for some travel and provides training and facilities for the Program. Participants are encouraged to seek additional sources of financial support to cover living expenses.






