Indian Act Registration

Bill S-3: Removal of 1951 Cut-off

On August 15, 2019, the Government of Canada removed the 1951 cut-off from the *Indian Act* registration provisions. This was the last remaining provision of Bill S-3 to come into force. As a result, all known sexbased inequities in the *Indian Act* have been eliminated. The removal of the 1951 cut-off ensures that all descendants born prior to April 17, 1985 (or of a marriage before that date) of women who lost status or were removed from band lists because of their marriage to a non-Indian man going back to 1869 will be entitled to registration. In addition to removing the 1951 cut-off from Indian registration, the legislation now in force will result in anyone previously entitled under the 6(1)(c) paragraphs of the *Indian Act* now being entitled under the new 6(1)(a) paragraphs.

Bringing Bill S-3 fully into force to ensure women receive the same rights as men is also in line with the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls' Calls to Justice.

Through the Collaborative Process on Indian Registration, Band Membership and First Nation Citizenship, First Nations expressed support for Indigenous women's right to Indian status through the removal of the 1951 cut-off. In addition to bringing all remaining provisions of Bill S-3 into force, the Government of Canada is moving forward with implementing these recommendations and will continue to work with First Nation communities on the implementation of these measures.

CANNABIS IN CANADA

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The *Cannabis Act* is designed to better protect the health and safety of Canadians, to keep cannabis out of the hands of youth, and to keep profits out of the hands of criminals and organized crime.



- To buy, possess or use cannabis and cannabis products, you must be of legal age (18 or 19 or older, depending on your province or territory).
- The Cannabis Act includes strict penalties for selling or providing cannabis and cannabis products to youth under the legal age.
- You can possess up to 30 grams of legal dried cannabis, or equivalent in non-dried form, in public.
- Legal cannabis products (except products with less than 0.3% THC or no THC) have an excise stamp on the package in different colours for each province and territory.
- It's illegal to take cannabis and cannabis products, including those with CBD, across the Canadian border, whether you're leaving or coming to Canada. This applies to all countries, whether cannabis is legal there or not.
- In late 2019, edible cannabis, cannabis extracts and cannabis topicals will begin to be available for legal purchase. These products will be in addition to cannabis products already available for purchase, such as dried cannabis and cannabis oil.



- If you choose to use cannabis, know the health effects and how to lower the risks to your health and safety. Like alcohol and tobacco, cannabis has risks, especially for youth and young adults.
- It can take up to two hours to begin to feel the effects of cannabis that you eat or drink, and up to four hours to feel the full effects, unlike the effects of smoking or vaping cannabis, which can be felt within minutes. Cannabis affects everyone differently. Even if its effects are delayed, you can still be impaired.
- **Don't drive high or work impaired**. Cannabis can impair your ability to operate vehicles or equipment safely. Driving while impaired by cannabis or any other drug is a serious criminal offence.
- If you possess cannabis, store it away from children, youth and pets. Be especially careful with edible cannabis, which can be mistaken for regular food or drink.
- Under the Cannabis Act, access to cannabis for medical purposes continues to be provided to those who are authorized by their healthcare practitioner.

2-STREAM Recycling Guide



2-Stream recycling means you separate paper products from all other recyclables. Use two containers, black box for fibres (e.g. beverage cartons, paper & boxboard) and blue box for all other acceptable recyclables. Place all excess paper including small amounts of shredded paper in an un-tied plastic/paper grocery bag in or beside your fibre recycling box.

STREAM 1 **Fibre Products** n Black Box ONLY



Paper Beverage Cartons: includes milk, juice & Tetra Pak cartons, drink boxes, paper hot beverage paper cups. DO NOT recycle foil pouches (i.e. Koolaid

Jammers), aluminum foil lined containers (e.g. wine), etc.



Household Paper/Newspaper, Catalogues, **Books, and Telephone Books:**

includes mail, white & coloured paper, envelopes, hard (remove the cover) and soft cover books, glossy publications, inserts/flyers.

DO NOT recycle waxed, foil, laminated or gift wrap paper, or fast food waxed soft drink cups.



Paper Egg Cartons and Boxboard:

such as cereal, tissue, detergent, cracker and shoe boxes. Remove liners and flatten.



Cardboard Boxes:

Break down, flatten and tie in bundles no larger than 75 cm x 75 cm x 20 cm (30" x 30" x 8") and place beside black box.

Please remove food residue and liners from pizza boxes.



STREAM 2 Food, Beverage & Liquid **Containers In Blue Box ONLY**



Glass Bottles and Jars: Please remove food and rinse.

> DO NOT recycle broken glass, drinking glasses, dishes, cups, other ceramics, window glass, light bulbs, mirrors, pottery, glass pots & pans.



Please remove food and rinse. DO NOT recycle coat hangers, pots,

needles, batteries and hazardous waste.

Aluminum Foil Containers and Foil: Pie plates, trays/baking pans and take-out food containers. Please remove/rinse food and flatten.

Plastic Bottles, Jugs and Tubs: Now accepting more plastic household rigid containers and tubs with numbers \triangle through \triangle on the bottom of the container, including clamshells and cleaning product containers.

DO NOT recycle toys, Styrofoam™, plastic wrap and bags, flowertrays, used oil containers, and unmarked plastics.

Note: Additional recycling boxes are available free of charge at all municipal centres.

Blue or Black Box Bloopers The following materials DO NOT belong in your Blue or Black Boxes:

Foil pouches (i.e. Koolaid Jammers) Aluminum foil lined containers (i.e. wine), etc.



Styrofoam[™] Containers (foam containers like coffee cups, egg cartons and protective foam packaging)

Waxed Boxboard (frozen food packaging, ice cream containers, etc.)



Shredded Paper Place in an un-tied plastic/paper grocery bag in or beside your fibre recycling box.
