Eliminating Red and White Health Cards

It is being advised that anyone who still carries an old red and white health card should plan to replace it with a secure photo health card before July 1, 2020. After July 1, 2020, these cards will no longer be accepted for Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP) services.

Photo health cards can easily be obtained for free at ServiceOntario by:

- Bringing the right original documents:
 - proof of Canadian citizenship or OHIP-eligible immigration status (Canadian passport,
 Canadian birth certificate or permanent resident document);
 - o proof of residency in Ontario (valid Ontario driver's licence; bank statements) and;
 - o proof of identity (Certificate of Indian Status, credit card or utility bill);
- Completing a Health Card Re-Registration form ahead of time or by getting one at ServiceOntario; and
- Visiting a ServiceOntario centre.

There is no cost or fee to switch to a photo health card. So, everyone needs to get an updated photo health card.

Regardless of an individual's health card status, Ontario's public hospitals cannot refuse to provide services to a patient who is faced with a life-threatening medical emergency.

Red and white card holders who do not convert by July 1, 2020, may be asked to pay up-front for insured health services. Once a photo health card is obtained, eligibility for Ontario health insurance is restored and any payments made for OHIP-insured health services will be promptly reimbursed once a valid health card is provided.

Student Examinations Regulations and Schedule

January 2020

Exam and Final Evaluation Considerations:

Five days are allocated at the end of each semester for the scheduling of formal exams and other final evaluations. This includes an allowance for inclement weather. Each school year these dates are clearly indicated (with an "E") on the LKDSB School Year Calendar which is posted online. Each secondary school will communicate its final exam schedule prior to the exams beginning by posting the schedule throughout the school and on the school website. The exams will be conducted in accordance with the Ontario Education Act, associated Regulations, and Ontario Schools 2016. They will also be implemented in accordance with the LKDSB Policies on Attendance and the current LKDSB Assessment and Evaluation Guidelines. If a major cultural or religious holiday occurs during an exam period, then LKDSB Senior Administration will provide direction to Principals.

Absences: All students are expected to write all of their final exams and other evaluations. Sometimes there are exceptional circumstances which may necessitate the rescheduling of a student's final exam (see approved absences below). Only the school Principal or their designate can approve an absence or rescheduling date during the scheduled exam days.

Notification Process: Any student (18 years old and over), or the parent/guardian of student under the age of 18, who may be absent from an exam should contact the school Principal as soon as possible prior to the scheduled exam date and time and provide documentation as may be requested. Any exceptional circumstance that might result in a request for the rescheduling of a final exam should be submitted to the school Principal at least two weeks prior to the scheduled exam date and time.

All efforts will be made to reschedule an exam (by 2:30 on the last scheduled day of exams) if necessary. Any absence from an exam for any reason that has not been approved by the school Principal can result in a mark of zero and could impact negatively on credit achievement and graduation requirements. Teachers, in consultation with their Principal, will use their professional judgement in establishing a final course mark for students.

<u>Buses:</u> Buses run at regular times, although they tend to leave early after school, because so few people are on the buses. It is best to arrange rides so you can go home and study. Eelŭnaapéewi Lahkéewiit buses are tentatively scheduled to leave at 11:30 a.m.

Exam Materials: NO books, papers, or calculators should be taken into the exam room unless authorized by your teacher. Cell phones, iPads, music devices, etc. are not allowed. Any form of cheating will result in a mark of zero for the exam.

Cafeteria: The cafeteria will be closed during exam days. The last day the cafeteria will be opened is Thursday, January 23rd.

Weather Policy: R.D.H.S. IS LOCATED IN ZONE 6

Listen to the radio (CFCO/CKSY). If the buses are not running, the exams are cancelled for that day. Any exams that are cancelled because of weather will be re-scheduled to the next school day. The exams to follow will also be delayed one day and will run according to the exam schedule.

If there is a fog day the buses will be delayed by 2 hrs and the exams will start 2 hours later.

Services for Youth

If you are an unemployed young person or a student, St. Clair College Employment Centre offers several Employment Ontario programs that can help you build skills or find a job - regardless of your background or circumstances.

Youth Job Connection is for unemployed young people (15 to 29 years old) facing challenges or complex barriers to finding work. These barriers include some combination of challenging life circumstances such as poverty or homelessness, limited work experience, a disability, low levels of education, or experiencing discrimination. The program offers opportunities for young people to learn about jobs and gain work experience so that they may secure long-term and meaningful employment. Through Youth Job Connection, you get:

- 60 hours of paid pre-employment training to prepare you for the workplace
- Job matching and paid job placements
- Mentorship, job-coaching and help with the transition to ongoing employment

For the year-round Youth Job Connection program, you must be between 15 and 29 years old, unemployed, not attending full-time school, and a resident of Ontario.

Youth Job Connection Summer also helps youth who face challenges or complex barriers to finding work, but is specifically for high school students (15 to 18 years old). You get:

- 20 hours of paid pre-employment training to prepare you for the workplace
- Summer jobs for up to eight weeks (or afterschool if they don't conflict with school)
- Mentorship, job-coaching and help returning to school after the program ends

For YJC-Summer, you must be between 15 and 18 years old, a resident of Ontario, and planning to stay in high school or to move on to postsecondary education.




