





# Free Graphic Recording Training Program to Support Species at Risk Initiatives

## Program Information and How to Apply

ECCC-CWS would like to use graphic recording in more species at risk engagement sessions going forward and as such, would like to invite members of Indigenous nations and organizations who are involved in gathering Indigenous Knowledge, facilitating meetings, consultation, engagement, and/or have an interest in this type of work, to consider this training and future work opportunities. You would be a great candidate for graphic recording training if:

- You are creative;
- You want to support species at risk;
- You are a good listener;
- You value capturing ideas and stories in a visual way; and,
- You want Indigenous Knowledge to be at the center of Species at Risk initiatives.

You can be any age! If you are extending this invitation to a youth in high school, we would welcome their participation in the program along with a mentor (e.g., staff, community leader) who can provide opportunities for them to practice their graphic recording skills at engagement related activities in your Nation or organization.

No advanced drawing skills are required to be a graphic recorder – only good listening skills and a desire to learn!

To deliver this free training (valued at \$2,800 CDN + GST) and support future work opportunities, we are working with <u>Drawing Change</u> to develop a Graphic Recording Training Program [the Program] to build capacity within Indigenous communities and organizations to provide internal and external graphic recording support. <u>Graphic recorders</u> listen, synthesize, and draw conversations in real time to capture the ideas and knowledge being shared within a group. Graphic recording can be used to increase community engagement, promote creative thinking, and support collaboration.

We are reaching out to share this potential virtual training opportunity for you or someone you know in your Nation or organization. We will be accepting up to 15 participants from across the country (approximately 3 per region - Pacific, North, Prairie, Ontario, Atlantic) and the costs of the program are covered through this project. The following is a summary of the Program outline, schedule, and expectations. #### Program Outline:

- Training is provided remotely through 5 online module sessions which will be held in late fall and early winter (see schedule below).
- Content includes the basics of graphic recording, lettering, developing a template for graphic recording, learning from guest speakers in the field, and possible business avenues.
- Opportunities throughout the Program to practice graphic recording by participating in regionally focused species at risk workshops organized and facilitated by CIER as part of this national project.
- A starter graphic recording kit will be provided to participants accepted into the Program.
- Post training paid work with <u>Drawing Change</u> for at least 2 program graduates (an opportunity to receive a \$500 contract).
- Potential post training paid work with ECCC-CWS and CIER on this species at risk project and other related engagement sessions.

#### chedule:

- In order to accommodate the multiple time zones and standard work and school weeks across the country, the module training sessions will be held on Saturdays in late fall and early winter. The training schedule will be provided once confirmed.
- Paid work opportunities with ECCC-CWS and CIER are available Monday-Friday from 8 am to 5 pm local time. These workshops involving graphic recording are approximately 3 hours in duration.

- We are only able to accept a limited number of participants. We hope participants will commit to attending all 5 online training sessions. If you are unable to attend one of the dates, please let us know in your application.
- Following each of Modules 2, 3, 4 and 5, participants will commit to attending <u>at least one</u> of the species at risk workshops that CIER organizes and facilitates to practice the skills they have learned.

# Eelŭnaapéewii Lahkéewiit Public Works Department Burial Arrangement Policy

## Introduction:

The Public Works Department is responsible for the digging and covering of burial plots within the Eelŭnaapéewii Lahkéewiit cemetery.

However, if any registered Eelŏnaapéewii Lahkéewiit member does not require these services, they must contact Public Works Manager, Brian Snake Sr. @226-626-4603.

## **Digging**

The following equipment is required:

- (1) Backhoe is the main source of equipment used for digging purposes, providing ground is viable
- (2) Shovels are a main tool for digging
- (3) Tape measure used for correct measurements
- (4) 2'x8'x10' boards for support
- (5) Standard Measurements for gravesites:
  - depth-4',
  - length-7'
  - width-3

## **Back Filling**

The following equipment is required:

- 1) Backhoe will be the main source used for back filling.
- 2) Shovels and Rakes also required.
- 3) Compacting the grave is important, to ensure no rainwater enters the grave; small compaction, metal tool used.
- 4) Flowers and Ornaments will be distributed, amongst the gravesite, when finished covering.

### **Visitors and Mourners**

If visitors and mourners are present, the roads department personnel must:

- Be respectful and compassionate to family / mourners.
- Not operate backhoe or create a disturbance in close proximity of family / mourners.

#### Fee

The cost of grave digging and covering will be a set fee of \$300.00, no exceptions.

(The responsibility lies within the Public Works Department to ensure the grave is fully covered and the Family is satisfied with the completed task).

### Please Note:

The Water table within the Eelŏnaapéewii Lahkéewiit community is very high (36" depth), so there may be excess water in the gravesite. If this is noticeable, please contact Public Works Manager, Brian Snake Sr. @226-626-4603.
