Event Details

Day 1 – Friday October 14, 2022 (see agenda for times)

Sacred Fire

The fire will be lit before sunrise on Friday and will burn until noon on Sunday. The head firekeeper will be Mike Hopkins Sr. All are welcome to come by and offer your prayers during the entire event.

Hunter's sunrise ceremony

This is a ceremony that grandfather & historian Darryl Stonefish revitalized many years ago. The ceremony gives thanks to grandfather sun and to ask Meesingw, the keeper of game, to help us have a successful harvest during the entire hunting season. This ceremony is a part of the big house ceremony. All are welcome.

Lunaapeew clothing workshop

Rena Dennison, an auntie to many, will share her many years of experience researching and creating clothing that was worn by our Lunaapeew ancestors. The hope is, this will inspire more of our people to create Lunaapeew inspired regalia, ceremonial dress that shows our pride and identity.

Storytelling

LHC members will lead & encourage participants to share knowledge of our collective history. Participants can share stories and experiences with little people, sabe, star people, Nanapush, ceremony, hoodoos, meesingw, hunting, creation and so on.

Day 2 – Saturday, October 15, 2022 (see agenda for times)

Sunrise ceremony

Our conductors will be aunties Lesley Snake & Robin King Stonefish.

Ribbon skirt making workshop

Grandmother Crystal Peters & auntie Becky Woodley will help participants create beautiful ribbon skirts they can wear any time and any where to show their pride in our culture. We will have enough supplies for 40 people.

Children's craft corner

Creative auntie Terri Heidbrick will create a fun space where children of all ages can express their artistic side while listening to our speakers through out the day!

Dip Net fishing

Brothers and grandfathers Don & Terrance Whiteye will share their personal experiences with dip net fishing and other harvesting within the Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit community.

Food sovereignty

Seed keeper Celeste Smith will share gardening techniques that will allow us to reclaim skills for growing and harvesting our own food. All skills she will share will help us to create a healthy relationship with creation.

The importance of language to identity

Second language speaker & auntie Kristin Jacobs will share her story and experience with the Lunaapeew language. She will share her thoughts on how learning the language will contribute to our identity as a people.

Lunaapeew social dancing

Grandfather Curtis Zunigha and long-time friend of the LHC, will lead use in song and dance with the help of brothers and song keepers Scott & Andrew Snake. Curtis will be teaching us the many dances that Lunaapeew people have done for centuries. Scott and Andrew will lead use in the Lunaapeew skin dance.

Day 3 – Sunday, October 16, 2022 (see agenda for times)

Sunrise ceremony

Our conductor will be fire keeper and grandfather Mike Hopkins Sr.

Youth Panel on governance

LHC co-chair Brent Stonefish will give a brief history of lunaapeew governance and imposed colonial governance. Then he will ask our youth panel members their thoughts on leadership and how they believe we can reclaim our way of governing. Our young leaders will be announced once they are confirmed.

Lunch with our champs

The LHC invites all our CHAMPS, young and old to share in a potluck meal starting at 12 noon. The LHC wants to acknowledge all of our community's athletes. This idea came out of a discussion over the two teams that won the 2022 all Ontario native fastball tournament in August. Then we started to talk about how sports have been a huge part of our identity in Eelūnaapéewi Lahkéewiit. We talked about all those past and present who have played baseball, hockey, lacrosse, football, volleyball, basketball, track, golf, and so on.

Giveaway and closing

We will be offering a small gift to all in attendance in the Lunapaapeew tradition of showing gratitude to all who have come to share their time with us 😊

Naming ceremony

Two of our youth will be receiving their names from their uncle Brent Stonefish. These two young Lunaapeewak offered their tobacco to Brent in the early summer. Brent will share his understanding of the importance of seeking out your spirit name and the process of asking someone to search for their name.

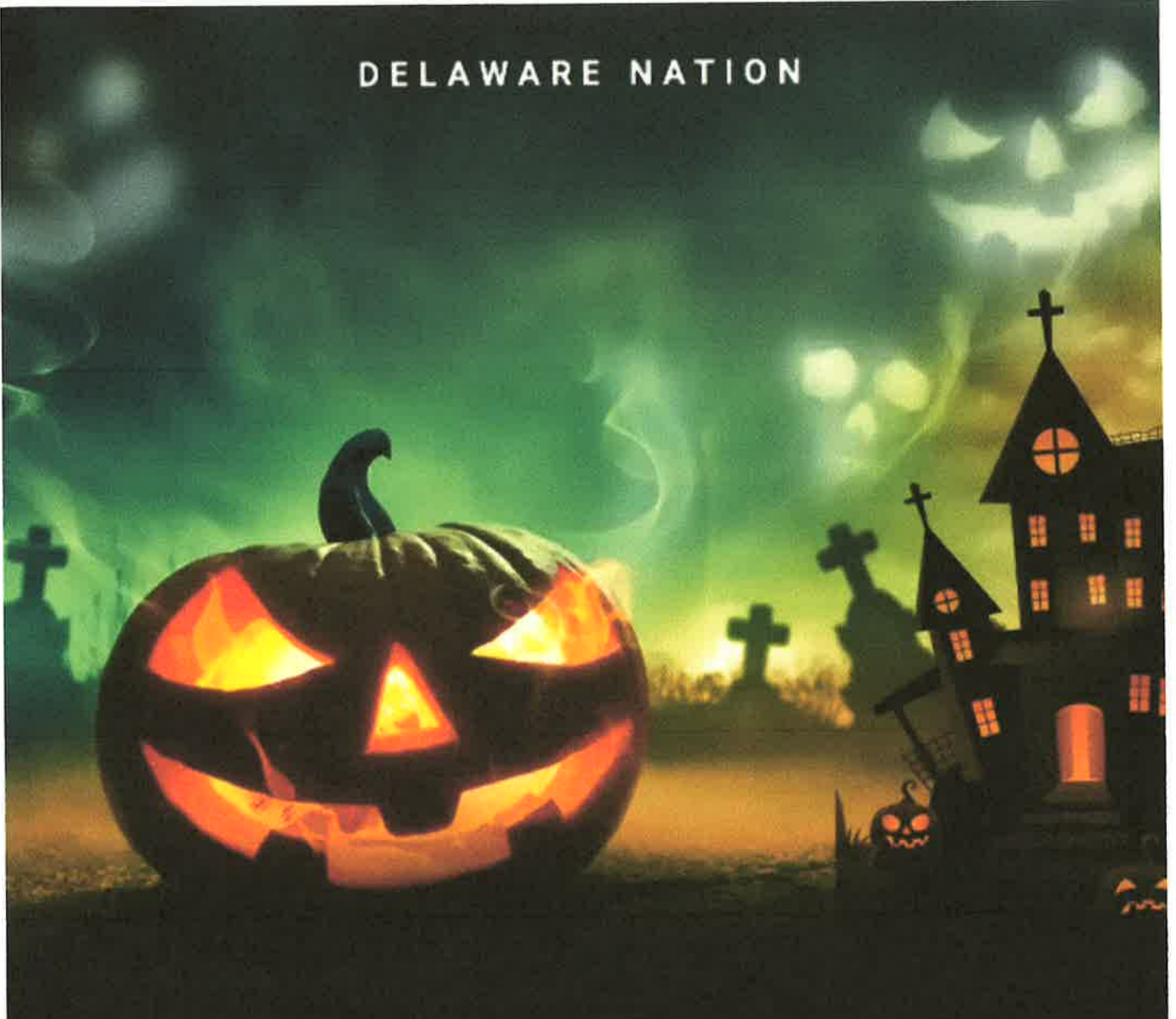

Delaware Nation Cultural Policy

Purpose:

To provide support to Delaware Nation community members living within the territory, requiring assistance. This assistance shall be for emotional, spiritual, physical and mental support. A portion of this policy will specifically address financial support, when available, that is sometimes necessary to carry out these objectives.

Accountability:

Information regarding this policy shall appear in written form in the community newsletter twice per year. The policy itself will be reviewed every two years with input from all related programming.

Eligibility Criteria:

- The applicant must reside within the Delaware Nation Territory
- The applicant must be a registered Delaware Nation band member
- The applicant must demonstrate a personal commitment to their own healing
- The applicant should display reasonable effort to support himself or herself financially to achieving their own personal health

Client Accountability

- The applicant will complete 1 hour of community service for every \$100 funded to be completed prior to the release of funding. Exemptions may apply in certain circumstances.
- The applicant will share their experience with the community through story, written or visual, without compromising personal healing experience. This event will occur within one month of return. Prior to the release of funding, the applicant will work in cooperation with the Cultural & Historical Worker to schedule a sharing event. Exemptions may apply in certain circumstances.
- **The applicant agrees to submit all necessary forms confirming his/her attendance at the event.**

- Failure to comply may result in repayment of funds or inability to access funding in the future

Funding Priorities:

- Community members committed to a lifestyle reformation for the first time.
- Community members making an application for the first time.
- Community members between the ages 18-25 years.
- Community members seeking specific healing affecting their immediate health, ie. Cancer, chronic diabetes and severe emotional problems.
- Community members on a fixed income with dependent under the age of 18 residing with them.
- Community members assisting their children/grandchildren to achieve a healthy lifestyle who have not accessed dollars within the last 12 months.
- Community members desiring additional traditional knowledge with a commitment of their own dollars.
- Commitment to volunteerism or demonstrated volunteerism.

Process:

Financial support is intended to enhance not replace individual efforts for traditional healing. The applicant must submit a written request to the Cultural & Historical Research Worker one month in advance of a financially assisted event. The Cultural & Historical Research Worker to provide the applicant with the necessary "Request Form" to be completed. The Cultural & Historical Research worker will offer support to the community member in filling out the application when deemed necessary. The Cultural & Historical Research Worker will provide recommendation to the Health Director for approval. The Cultural & Historical Research Worker will respond in writing to this request within five (5) business days.

Eligible Activities:

- Ceremonies
- Sweat Lodge
- Traditional/cultural teachings at the discretion of the Cultural & Historical Research Worker

Request for Financial Support:

All request for funding will be submitted on the "Request Form". Request Forms will be made readily available to the public. All request for funding will be submitted in Canadian dollars and receipts will be provided within 7 days of the clients return.

- Adults: not to exceed \$500.00 per year.
- Youth: not to exceed \$350.00 per year. Youth is 12-18 years.
- Child: not to exceed \$250.00 per year. Child is 6-12 years.

Allowances:

Meals	up to \$30/day
Mileage	up to \$.20/km
Accommodations	up to \$150/night

If approved for accommodations funding, \$50/night will be released and the remainder reimbursed when receipts are provided.

Appeal:

The applicant can submit an application in writing to the Band Administrators to dispute any reasonable request denied by the Health Director.
