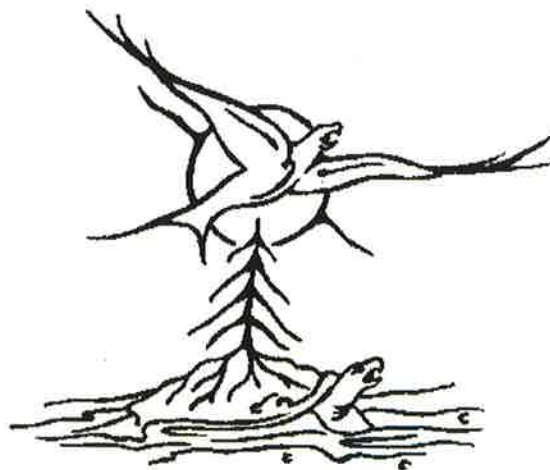

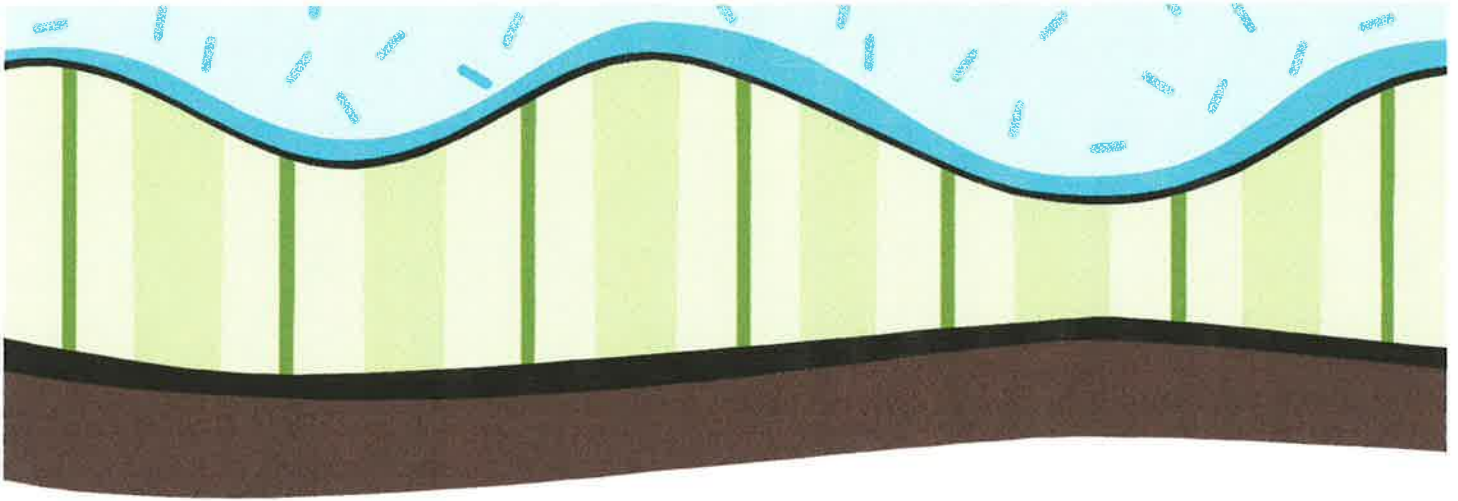

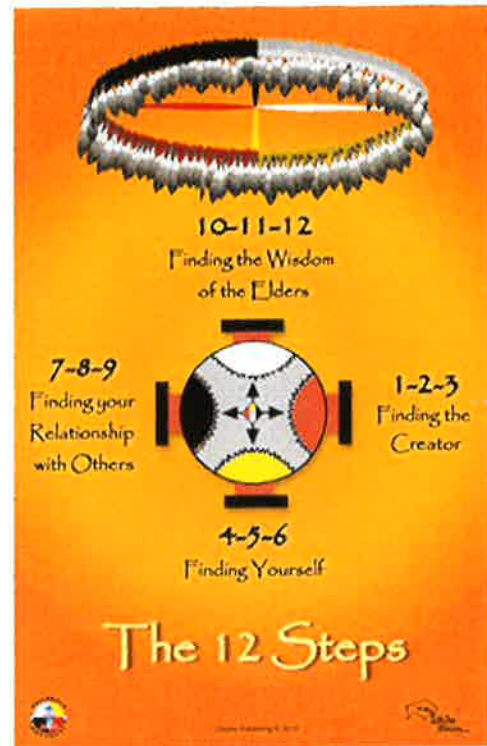

Respond to an Overdose



Call 911 Immediately

***Remember: The law protects you from being arrested or charged if you are seeking emergency assistance. Don't stall, make the call!**



Give naloxone.

***Naloxone is available for free at the CK Public Health, Clinic Services office.
A health card is not required.**



Stay with and assist.

***It is important that you do not leave the persons side until
paramedics arrive.**



Send person to hospital with paramedics

5 STEPS TO RESPOND TO AN OPIOID OVERDOSE

SHOUT & SHAKE
their name & their shoulders

1 spray into nostril or inject 1 vial or ampoule into arm or leg.

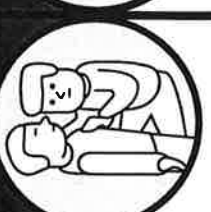

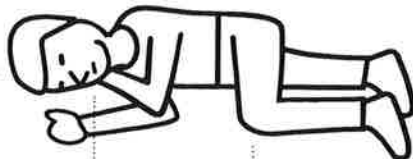
IS IT WORKING?

If **no** improvement after 2-3 minutes, repeat steps 3 & 4.
Stay with them.

RECOVERY POSITION

If the person begins breathing on their own, or if you have to leave them alone, put them in the recovery position.

head should be tilted back slightly to open airway



hand supports head

knee stops body from rolling onto stomach

SIGNS OF OPIOID OVERDOSE

- Person can't be woken up
- Breathing is slow or has stopped
- Snoring or gurgling sounds
- Fingernails and lips turn blue or purple
- Pupils are tiny or eyes are rolled back
- Body is limp

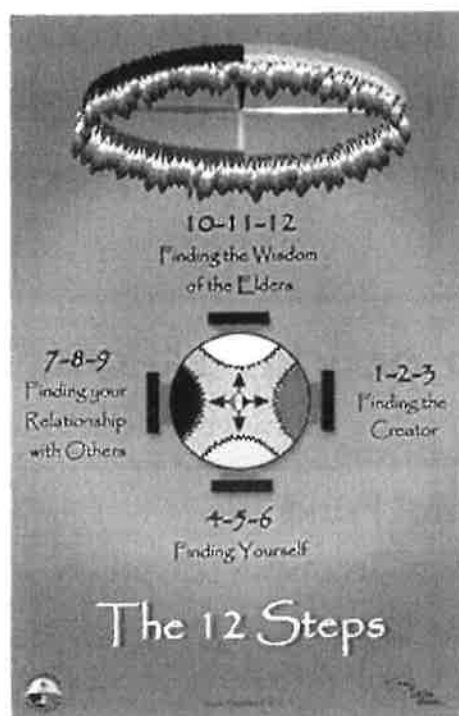

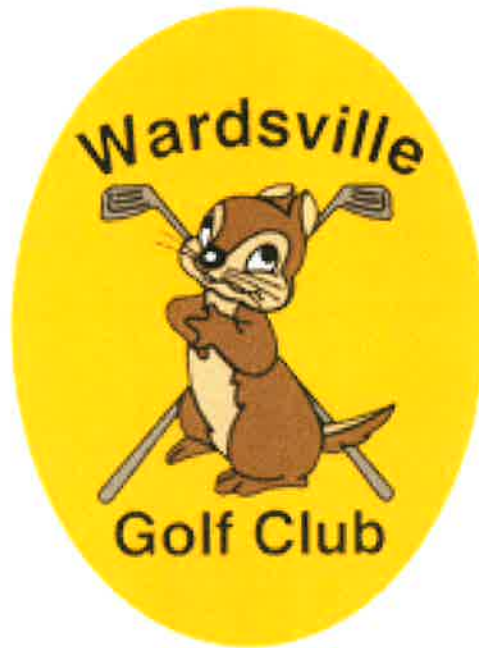
