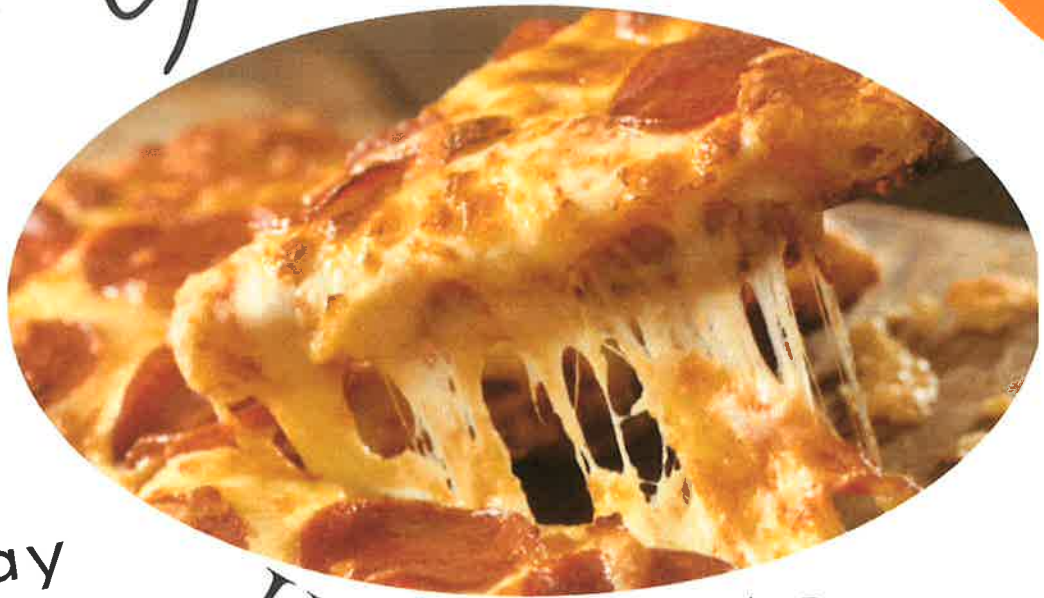

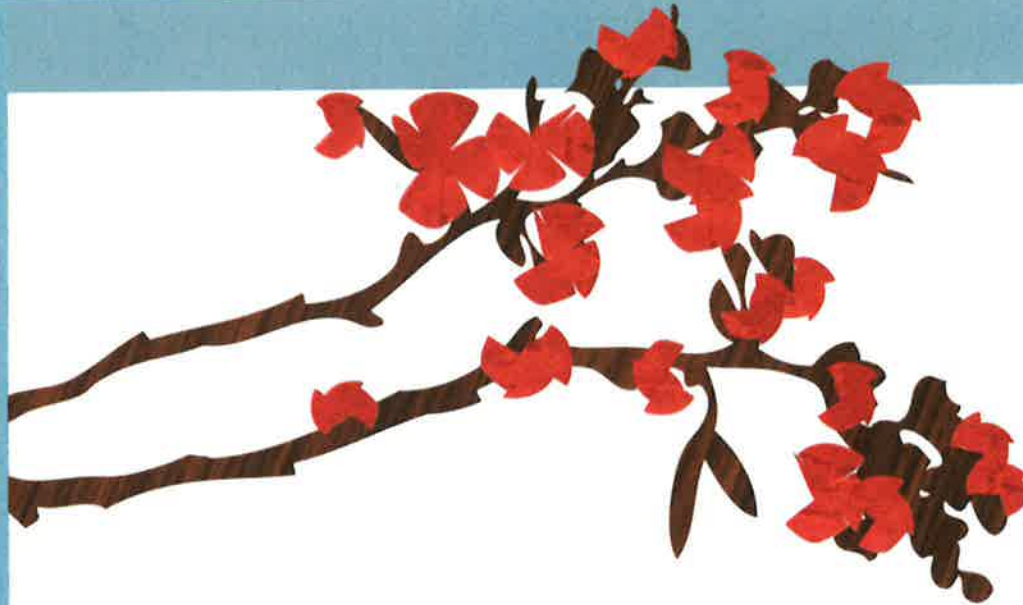

The Effects of **SECONDHAND SMOKE**

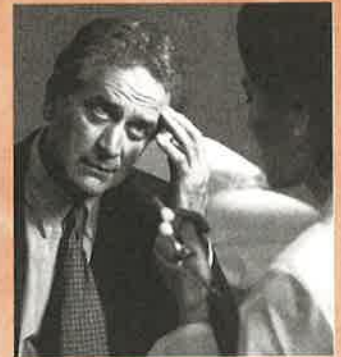
Secondhand smoke—also known as environmental tobacco smoke, passive smoke, and tobacco smoke pollution—is a mixture of the smoke exhaled by a smoker and smoke from the lit end of a cigarette, cigar, or pipe. It contains more than 4,000 chemicals—including at least 60 known carcinogens (cancer-causing substances). People exposed to secondhand smoke are at increased risk for many negative health conditions.

There is no safe level of secondhand smoke exposure.

Secondhand Smoke Dangers to Nonsmoking Adults

In nonsmoking adults, secondhand smoke:

- Can cause lung cancer
- Can cause cardiovascular disease, including heart attack and stroke.
- Is associated with chronic lung conditions such as asthma and bronchitis



Secondhand Smoke Dangers to Children

Because of their developing lungs, children are especially vulnerable to secondhand smoke. It is estimated that more than 50% of the world's children are exposed to secondhand smoke in their own homes. A child who spends an hour in a room filled with secondhand smoke breathes in as many harmful chemicals as a person who smokes 10 or more cigarettes.

Secondhand smoke may increase:

- An infant's risk for low birthweight if his or her mother is exposed to secondhand smoke during pregnancy
- An infant's risk for sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS)
- A child's risk for severe infections of the lower respiratory tract, such as bronchitis and pneumonia
- A child's risk for asthma and more severe asthma symptoms
- A child's risk for ear infections—a leading cause of childhood hearing loss



Additional Secondhand Smoke Problems for Both Children and Adults

Eye and nose irritation

Coughing and wheezing

Headache

Sore throat

Cavities

Reduced lung function

What's in Secondhand Smoke?

Here are just a few of the harmful substances in secondhand smoke as well as other products in which they are commonly found:

- Acetone—nail polish remover
- Acrolein—pesticide
- Ammonia—floor and toilet cleaner
- Benzene—industrial solvent
- Butane—cigarette lighter fluid
- Cadmium—batteries
- Carbon monoxide—car exhaust
- Formaldehyde—embalming fluid
- Hydrogen cyanide—gas chamber poison
- Methanol—rocket and car fuel
- Naphthalene—mothballs
- Phenol—disinfectants
- Polonium-210—radioactive compound
- Toluene—paint thinner

How Can I Protect Myself and Others From Secondhand Smoke?

Secondhand smoke is a definite health threat. Legislation has been passed in many places to protect people from secondhand smoke in the workplace and other public areas. In time, greater awareness of the dangers of secondhand smoke may encourage the passage of more protective measures.



Here are some steps you can take to help protect you and your loved ones:

- If you smoke, stop. Consult your healthcare professional about the best ways to help you quit.
- Don't allow smoking in your home. Tell smokers to go outside. Air conditioners, fans, air filters, and open windows can't remove the dangerous substances in secondhand smoke. Sealing off a special room for smoking won't eliminate secondhand smoke, either—it can still travel to other rooms.
- Don't allow smoking in your vehicle.
- Don't allow smoking around your children under any circumstances.
- Don't allow caregivers to smoke around your elderly parents.
- Encourage workplace smoking-cessation programs.
- Patronize smoke-free businesses and restaurants.
- Educate others about the dangers of secondhand smoke, and advocate for smoke-free environments.
