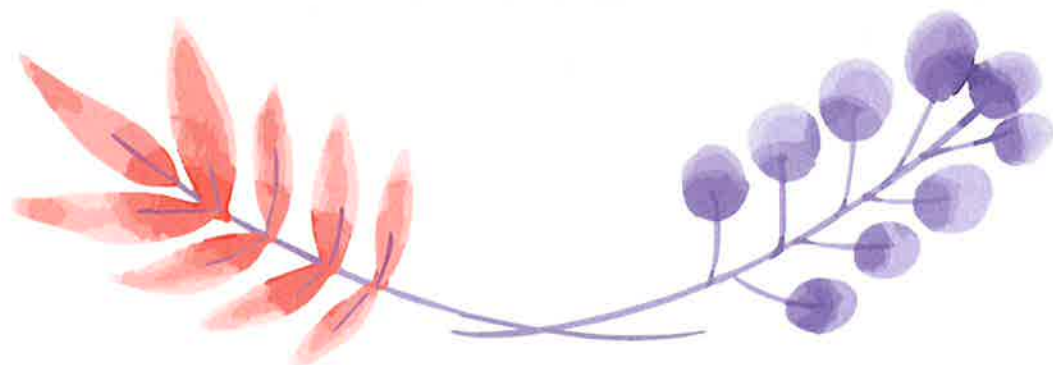

Aboriginal Youth Career Fair

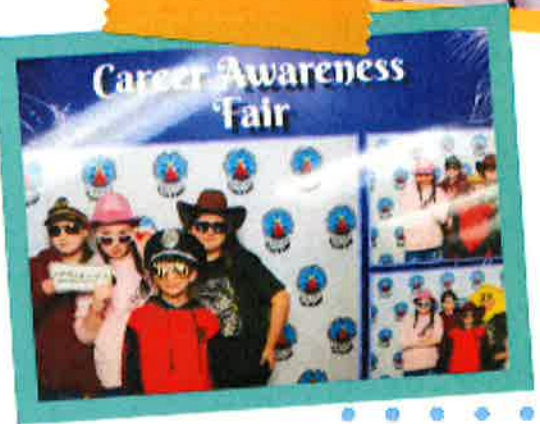

PURPOSE

The AIAI Lois Cornelius Scholarship Award was created to promote and recognize First Nations excellence in Education and to honour the memory of AIAI Elder Lois Cornelius.
