Are you at risk?

Take 10 minutes to answer these 10 questions.

The answers will help you know if you should talk to your health care provider about having your kidney function checked.



Did you know

1 in 10 Canadians have kidney disease
1 in 3 Indigenous people in Canada have kidney disease

There are a number of risk factors for kidney disease, some that you can control, and others that you cannot.

Because there are often no symptoms until kidney disease is quite advanced, many people aren't aware that they have kidney problems until they've already lost most of their kidney function.

That's why it's so important to know the risk factors for kidney disease and to talk to your health care provider about checking your kidney function.



Do you have diabetes?

Uncontrolled blood sugar levels can damage your kidney filters.

Do you have high blood pressure?

Yes No



Poorly controlled high blood pressure can cause loss of kidney function by damaging the tiny filters of the kidney.

Do you currently smoke?

Yes No



Smoking damages the kidneys by hardening the arteries and narrowing the blood vessels, which can decrease kidney blood flow and cause kidney damage.

Are you First Nations, Métis, or Inuit?

First Nations, Métis, and Inuit in Canada are more than three times as likely to have their kidneys fail.

Are you 65 years of age or older?

Kidney disease becomes more common as you get older.

Do you have blood vessel problems like heart attack, stroke or limb amputation?

Yes No



Blood vessel disease affects the tiny filters of the kidneys just like the blood vessels in the heart, brain, and legs. Heart disease and kidney disease are closely linked.

Do you have a family history of kidney failure?

Yes No

Even if only one person in a family has kidney failure, all blood relatives should be tested. Family history is also a factor in the development of both diabetes and high blood pressure.

Do you take pain medication like Ibuprofen®, Advil®, Aleve®, Motrin®, Celebrex®, or Naproxen®?

These medications can cause chronic kidney damage if used in large amounts and for a long period of time.

Are you at an unhealthy weight?

Yes No



Obesity has been linked to chronic kidney disease.

Have you had any problems with your urinary system and/or prostate gland (e.g., multiple kidney stones, prostate cancer, kidney cancer, or recurrent urinary tract infections)?

Yes No

Issues of the urinary system and/or prostate gland can sometimes contribute to kidney problems.

If you have **8 or more** risk factors, you should schedule an appointment with your healthcare provider in the next few months to have your kidney function checked. Bring this form with you to review together.

Two tests are needed to test your kidney function:

- Blood test for serum creatinine and GFR (GFR stands for glomerular filtration rate). *This tests how well the kidneys are removing waste products.*
- Urine test for albumin-creatinine ratio (ACR). *This tests for damage to the kidney filters.*

Scholarship Opportunities



The Association of Iroquois and Allied Indians is offering four Scholarships, each one valued at \$2,000, to assist our Member Nation students in their post secondary endeavors in Language, Health, and Education.

THE LOIS CORNELIUS EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

The AIAI Lois Cornelius Scholarship was created to honour the memory of AIAI Elder, Lois Corenlus, who truly embodied First Nations excellence in education and believed that youth could accomplish anything they set their mind to.

THE LANGUAGE CHAMPION SCHOLARSHIP

The Language Champion Scholarship was created to recognize the efforts of the individual who works to preserve and revitalize their Nations language.

HEALTH SCHOLARSHIP (2 - Available)

The Health Scholarships were created to promote and recognize excellence in a Health or Traditional healing post secondary program & encourage other First Nations to enter the health profession.

Applications must include the following:

- A **self profile** detailing why you should receive one of the four scholarships (500 word max)
- Transcripts displaying your current academics.

Re: Water Analysis Result-Moravian of The Thames First Nation-Health Centre

Water samples taken from the Moravian Town Health Centre on February 19, 2026, come out with sodium level 77 mg/l. The result indicates that sodium level analysed is above 20 mg/L.

The guideline for sodium in the Guidelines for Canadian Drinking Water Quality and the standard for sodium in the Ontario Drinking Water Quality Standards is 20 mg/L for those on **sodium restricted diets** and 200 mg/L **for non-sodium restricted diets**. Sodium in drinking water is not considered to be toxic to a healthy person, however if someone is on a sodium restricted diet they should seek the advice of a physician. Please see the attached information sheet

Media Release**Feb 27, 2026****CK Public Health Warns of Increased Drug Poisonings in Chatham-Kent**

CK Public Health is issuing an alert about an increase in drug poisonings (overdoses) and unexpected reactions to substances in Chatham-Kent based on elevated opioid-related EMS calls over the last several days.

There are reports about the presence of strong tranquilizers in the local drug supply resulting in heavy sedation.

This serves as an important reminder that the unregulated drug supply is unpredictable and always changing. Substances may not be what individuals expect, increasing the risk of harm or death.

In case of overdose:

- Call 911
- Give naloxone if an opioid overdose is suspected (it may take more than one dose)
- Do not leave the person unattended
- Stay with and assist the person until paramedics arrive

If you use substances:

- Try to avoid using alone, fix with a friend
- If using with others, take turns spotting for each other
- Have a safety plan, ask someone to check on you, leave door unlocked
- Call the National Overdose Response Service (NORS) Safer Consumption Hotline at 1-888-688-6677
- Start low and go slow, try a test dose first
- Check your drugs with test strips
- Be aware of your tolerance
- Try to avoid mixing drugs
- Know the quality of your drugs
- Ask others about what they are experiencing with the current drug supply

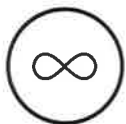

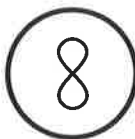
