Males and age groups 30-59 are most impacted and half of all opioid toxicity deaths occur among people living in areas experiencing the highest level of material resource deprivation. |

Guided by an Indigenous community development model, PLAY and its partners create safe and inclusive spaces where children and youth can share their ideas, their hopes and their fears, and learn the skills to become positive agents of change.
