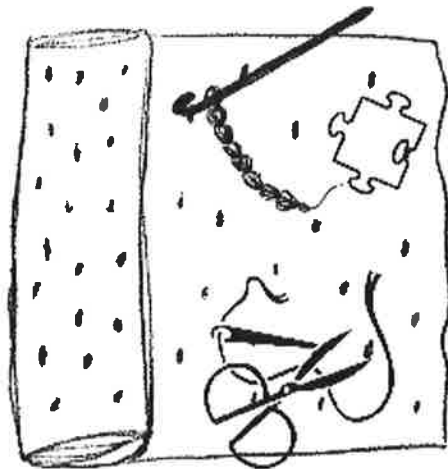

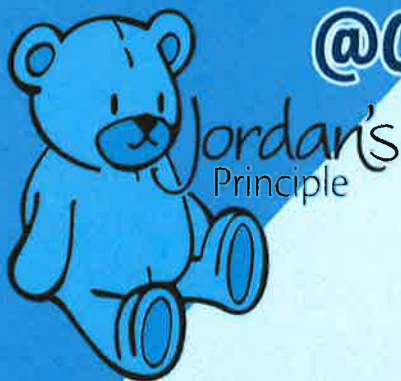

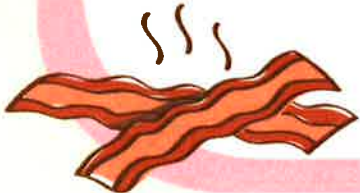

CANADA'S WONDERLAND

Chaperone Policy – Effective May 1, 2026

The safety of our guests and associates remains a top priority at Canada's Wonderland. As part of our ongoing commitment to maintaining a safe, family friendly environment. This **policy is enforced daily beginning at 4:00pm** and the park reserves the right to implement it earlier as operational needs require. **Guests who fail to comply with this policy may be subject to removal from the park and any application actions permitted under the law.**

All guests 15 years of age or younger must be accompanied by a **parent, guardian or chaperone age 21 and older** for entry into Canada's Wonderland and must remain in the park and be reachable by park staff if needed. This policy is enforced daily beginning at 4:00PM and the park reserves the right to implement earlier as operational needs require.

A valid government issued photo ID with date of birth is required for all chaperones at the time of entry. One (1) chaperone may accompany no more than ten (10) guests aged 15 or younger. Chaperones must enter the park with their group and remain in the park and be reachable by park staff if needed.

Any guest 15 years old or younger found inside the park without a qualifying chaperone when the policy is active will be **immediately subject to removal from the park**. This requirement applies to all guests, including all Season Pass and Membership holders.
