## What is cancer screening and why is it important?

Cancer screening in Ontario is a proactive way to detect cancer early, even before symptoms appear, through organized programs like breast, cervical, colorectal, and lung screening. These programs use evidence-based tests to identify abnormal changes sooner, when treatment is more effective and less invasive. Early detection can significantly improve outcomes, reduce mortality, and support overall population health. Screening also helps individuals better understand their personal health risks and empowers them to take preventive action, making it an essential part of maintaining long-term wellness.

# Ontario Breast Screening Program (OBSP)

## BREAST SCREENING

- Call an Ontario Breast Screening Program (OBSP) location to book a **mammogram** if you are:
  - Between 40 - 74 years old
  - **Have no current breast problems (see below)**
  - Have no history of breast cancer
  - Have not had a mastectomy
  - Have not had a mammogram in the last 11 months
  - If transfeminine, have has at least five years of feminizing hormone use in a row
- Talk to you Primary Care Provider if you are experiencing any of the following symptoms:
  - Breast swelling
  - Sharp pain in breast/nipple
  - Lump/Redness/Discharge
  - Change in skin texture
  - Inverted nipple

# Ontario Cervical Screening Program (OCSP)

## CERVICAL SCREENING

- Ask your doctor, nurse practitioner or midwife for a cervical screening **HPV test** if you meet the below criteria:
  - Are 25 - 70 years old
  - Have a cervix
  - Have had intercourse (sex), digital (using fingers) or oral (using mouth) sexual activity involving the genital area with a partner of any sex
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible if you are experiencing any of the following symptoms:
  - Pain during sex
  - Unexplained pain in your back
  - Unexplained pain in your pelvis
  - Vaginal bleeding after sex
  - Vaginal bleeding after menopause
  - Watery vaginal discharge with a strong odor

# ColonCancerCheck (CCC)

## COLORECTAL SCREENING

- Ask your doctor or nurse practitioner for an at-home **Fecal Immunochemical Test (FIT)** if you:
  - Are 50 - 74 years old
  - Do not have a parent, sibling, or child that has previously been diagnosed with colorectal cancer
  - Do not have previous polyps that require surveillance
  - Do not have inflammatory bowel disease (ex. Chron's Disease, or ulcerative colitis)
- A **colonoscopy** will be booked for you you have a parent, sibling, or child that has been diagnosed with colorectal cancer.
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible if you are experiencing any of the following symptoms:
  - Constipation or diarrhea
  - Blood in your stool
  - Unexplained weight loss
  - Stomach pain

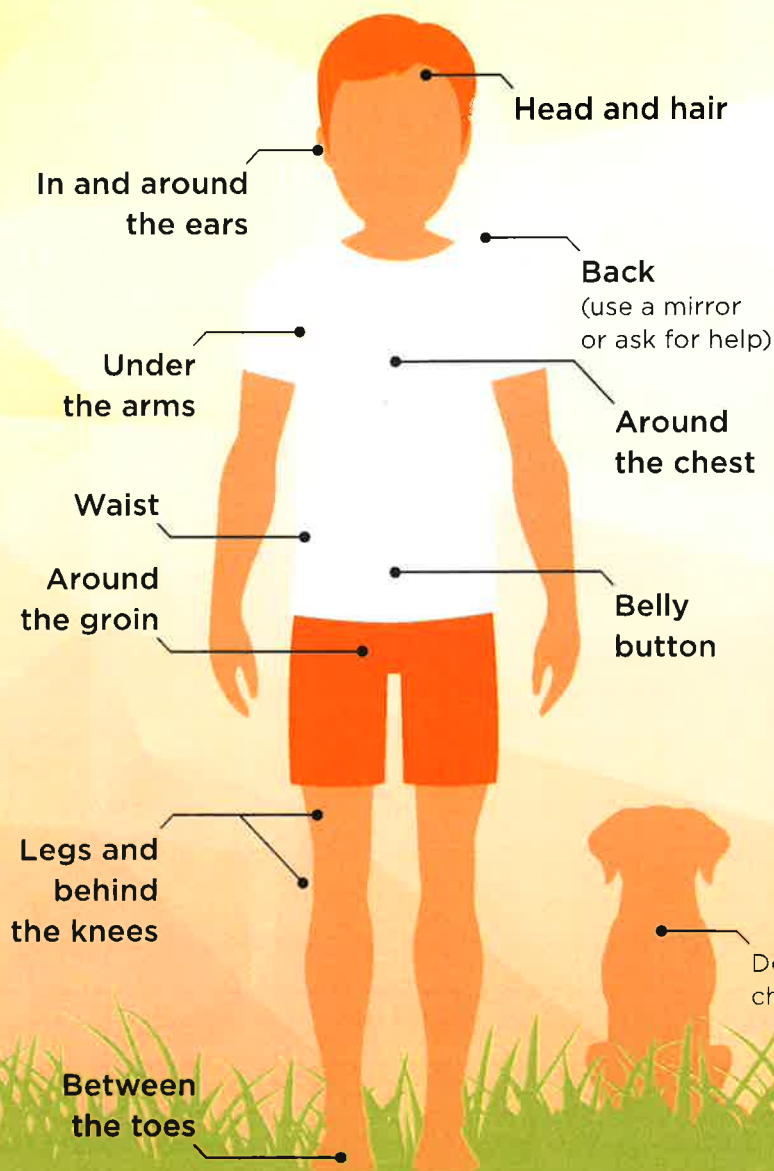

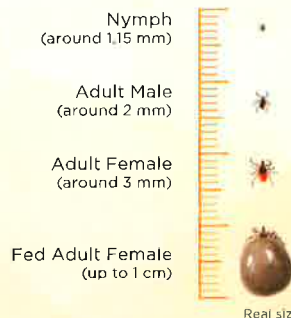

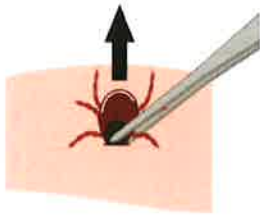

## HOW TO REMOVE A TICK AFTER A BITE

### USE TWEEZERS

**Grasp the tick with tweezers as close as possible to the skin.**

Avoid pressing on the tick's abdomen. It increases the risk of transmitting the bacteria responsible for Lyme disease.

### DO NOT TURN NOR CRUSH THE TICK

**Pull gently, straight up.**

Allow the entire tick to be removed without breaking it. If the tick's head stays implanted in the skin, you may then be able to remove it delicately with tweezers. If you cannot remove the head, leave it in place and let the skin heal. Your body will naturally reject it. If you are using a tick remover, follow the manufacturer's instructions.

### WASH THE AFFECTED AREA

**Clean your skin.**

After removing the tick, clean your skin with soap and water, and wash your hands thoroughly.

### SEND A PICTURE TO ETICK

**Get the tick identified, for free.**

By submitting a tick picture on eTick.ca or on the eTick app, you can receive a quick species identification by our trained personnel, to know if you or your pet might have potentially been exposed to tick-borne diseases such as Lyme disease.

### BE SURE TO KEEP THE TICK

**Place the tick in a container that closes tightly.**

Use an empty pill container, for example. Mark part of the body that was bitten and the date the tick was removed, then store it in the refrigerator. The tick could be useful if you need to see a doctor or take more pictures.
