- A \$50 Refundable Deposit is required for each canoe.
- Must be 19 years of age or older to rent.
- A signed liability waiver is required before renting.
- Must be a DN Band Member or have proof of Residency to rent.
- Must have a Valid Status Card/Photo ID
- Transportation of the canoe is the responsibility of the renter. No Delivery or Pick up available.
- Life jackets must be worn at all times.
- Renters are responsible for returning all equipment in good condition.
- Canoes must be returned by the agreed-upon return time.
